About 69% of pets living in underserved communities have never seen a veterinarian, and the tribal communities in our service area lack the resources to rescue all the stray and injured animals. Reservation Animal Rescue (RAR), a program of Partnership With Native Americans (PWNA), supports tribal partners like Round Valley Animal Rescue in Springerville, AZ, that foster, rehabilitate and place abandoned dogs and cats.

Emery and Gale adopted their energetic Australian Shepherd named Reba from RVAR, and in turn, Reba keeps them healthy and active in their retirement. Thanking RAR donors for their efforts, Emery said, *"It's a blessing to get that kind of support, and takes a special kind of person to help take care of these animals."*

PWNA's Northern Plains Reservation Aid (NPRA) program offers a Breakfast-in-a-Bag service to provide Elders in need with nutritious food near the end of the month when social security income is depleted.

Rosebud Sioux Elder Loretta, age 80, uses the Breakfast service regularly to support a healthy diet. Without this help, she says it would be harder to eat full meals in a place where her neighbors go door to door for food.
