Native families face many challenges from food shortages to subpar housing and transportation. To improve food access, PWNA provides services like Emergency Food Boxes, distributing nonperishable foods to Elders through senior centers like Cibecue Elderly Services in Arizona.

Born in 1939, Fannie of the White Mountain Apache Tribe was grateful to receive an Emergency Food Box. With the onset of some mental decline, Fannie currently lives with her son. *"We appreciate your contribution because it helps our Elders... They know they have somebody out there thinking of them."*

To help Native students become better readers, our American Indian Education Fund (AIEF) program offers a Literacy service, sending books and incentives for students to our program partners.

Kindergarteners like Natalie are learning to sound out words and build a foundation for literacy. While her mom has trouble battling poor road conditions to bring her kids to school, Natalie's reading scores have increased 43% since the fall, putting her at the top of her class.
